<p>The most common mistake with the spelling of disastrous is to leave an 'i' after the 's'.</p> <p>To make sure you don't do this think of the following:</p> <p>It was disastrous for the children on board the Challenger space shuttle.</p> <p>DISASTROUS</p>  <p>disastrous</p>	<p>HOW TO SPELL NEIGHBOUR</p> <p>OUR EIGHT Noisy Neighbours</p> <p>NEIGHBOURS</p>  <p>neighbour</p>	<p>HOW TO SPELL CONSCIENCE</p> <p>He had a guilty conscience about cheating in the conscience exam. Don't say conscience, say "CON SCIENCE".</p> <p>CON SCIENCE</p> <p>CONSCIENCE</p>  <p>conscience</p>
<p>HOW TO SPELL MISCHIEVOUS</p> <p>The most common mistakes with the spelling of mischievous are to put in an extra 'i' after the 'v', to mischievous, or not include the 'i' before the 'e'.</p> <p>To make sure you don't do this think of the following:</p> <p>Mischievous has me to chiffy nervous.</p> <p>Mis CHIE VOUS</p> <p>MISCHIEVOUS</p>  <p>vehicle</p>	<p>HOW TO REMEMBER TO SPELL VEHICLE</p> <p>The common mistake made with the spelling of vehicle is to end with 'air' instead of 'ice'.</p> <p>To make sure you don't do this, think of the following:</p> <p>That vehicle needs cleaving.</p> <p>VEHICLE</p> <p>VEHICLE</p>  <p>vehicle</p>	<p>HOW TO SPELL CONSCIOUS</p> <p>The common mistake when spelling conscious is to forget the 'i' or 'c' before the 'o' in the middle. To remember the correct spelling think of the following:</p> <p>She was conscious of how she was going to cheat together enough money for the conscious.</p> <p>con SCIOUS S</p> <p>CONSCIOUS</p>  <p>conscious</p>
<p>HOW TO SPELL INDIVIDUAL</p> <p>The common mistake made with the spelling of individual is to add an extra 'i' at the end. To make sure you don't do this, think of the following:</p> <p>Each individual gets a party seat indicated in his or her card.</p> <p>in INDIVID UAL</p> <p>INDIVIDUAL</p>  <p>individual</p>	<p>HOW TO SPELL ACHIEVE</p> <p>The common mistake with the spelling of achieve is to put the 'i' and first 'e' in the wrong order.</p> <p>To make sure you don't do this, think of the following:</p> <p>In order to achieve success on this diet you must eat ing.</p> <p>ach IEVE</p> <p>ACHIEVE</p>  <p>achieve</p>	<p>HOW TO SPELL AMATEUR</p> <p>A mate you are.</p> <p>A MATE U R</p> <p>AMATEUR</p>  <p>amateur</p>
